Course Outline and Objectives

This course is jointly organized by SPICE (Stanford Program on International and Cross-Cultural Education) of Stanford University and School of Social Sciences at Waseda University. The purpose of the course is to foster participants' awareness of existing social issues in Japan, develop knowledge and understand of diverse perspectives, and cultivate critical thinking and innovative thinking skills that promote social changes. Students who complete the course will receive a certificate of completion from SPICE/Stanford University and the School of Social Sciences/Waseda University.

Outline

- 1. The course will be held for five days from 6th March (MON) to 10th March (FRI) in person.
- 2. The course will be offered to undergraduate students at School of Social Sciences (free of charge).
- 3. Students will learn and engage in discussions with guest speakers.
- 4. Students will give presentations during the final class.
- 5. Students will be required to come up with an idea to solve social problems.
- 6. Students will not receive any credits, but receive a certificate after completing the program.
